



## THE SANGER PLEDGE and THE CENTRAL VALLEY PROMISE

#### **Student Pledge:**

- I WILL explore and pursue many different college and career opportunities, develop goals and create a plan to meet those goals
- 2) I WILL be responsible for my academic and behavioral actions by maintaining the following On Track indicators:
  - A GPA of 2.7 or better
  - 96% Attendance or better
  - No grade of a D or F in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies
  - No suspensions
- 3) I WILL successfully complete challenging high school courses focusing on my career plan, including the College Entrance A-G Requirements, career technical education, internship opportunities, and civic learning
- 4) I WILL prepare for college and careers by developing my skills of the Sanger Graduate Profile by becoming a strong:
  - Critical Thinker
  - Life long learner
  - Effective communicator
  - Productive citizen
  - Collaborator
  - Technologically literate learner
  - Creative learner
- 5) I WILL meet all the expectations of the Central Valley Promise\*

#### Sanger Unified Pledge:

- 1) WE PLEDGE that ALL students will have the options to demonstrate what they learn and the opportunities to be successful and achieve their dreams.
- 2) WE PLEDGE to help students successfully transition to and succeed in college and career by:
  - Learning about college and career opportunities, develop goals and create a plan to meet those goals.
  - Visiting college campuses AND visiting career opportunities in the Central Valley
  - Learning about, taking and completing college preparatory courses and career technical education courses
- 3) WE PLEDGE to provide both academic and socio-emotional support for all students to remain On Track to graduate from high school and achieve college and career readiness.
- 4) WE PLEDGE to maximize instructional strategies and develop educational programs that promote successful attainment of the Sanger Graduate Profile.
- 5) WE PLEDGE to provide the support for all students to meet the expectations of the Central Valley Promise\*

#### **Sanger Pledge and Sanger USD Students**

PLEDGE: Sanger Unified will provide ONE student from each SUSD feeder School (17 total) with a \$1,000 scholarship at the end of the senior year that meets all the following requirements:

#### Student Criteria to Meet the Sanger Pledge in grades 6-12

- Students MUST have a minimum cumulative 9<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup> grade GPA of 2.7
- Students MUST have a minimum 96% Attendance rate
- Students MUST not have a final grade of a D or F in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Studies
- Students MUST not have any suspensions. However, will allow for one Restorative Justice opportunity in grades 6-8<sup>th</sup> and one Restorative Justice opportunity in grades 9-12<sup>th</sup>. (48915c violations will be excluded from Restorative Justice)

\*The Central Valley Promise is a community-wide effort to promote college as a viable option for youth in our region. The Promise will ensure that if students and their parents pledge to do what it takes in middle and high school to prepare, college will be there for them in the future, guaranteed.

# \*Student and Parent Pledge (beginning as early as 6<sup>th</sup> grade)

- 1. I will use the Central Valley Promise mobile app and/or website to get updates on career and college information and events.
- 2. I will learn as much as I can about college and careers throughout middle and high school, and I will share what I learn with my family.
- 3. I will prepare for college and careers by behaving like a scholar and making the most of the extra help that I am provided including regularly visiting my school counselor.
- 4. I will visit at least one community college and one university campus with my parents/family members during by my sophomore year.
- 5. I will take challenging high school courses, including the College Entrance / A-G Requirements, career technical education, internship opportunities, and service learning.
- 6. I will apply for financial aid during my senior year through the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or the California Dream Act Application (CADAA), due in October each year.
- 7. I will also apply for local, regional, and national scholarship opportunities.
- 8. I will explore and pursue many different college and career opportunities, especially those in the Central Valley.

#### \*The Central Valley Promise

- 1. Promises that, starting in sixth grade, all students and families will be provided information, services, and resources to prepare for college and careers through the mobile app, website, and from school teachers, counselors, and administrators.
- 2. Promises to provide college and career counseling/advising through middle and high school and while in college and/or university.
- 3. Promises that all students who successfully complete minimum college preparatory requirements will be offered admission to community college with the first semester tuition free or to non-impacted degree programs at Fresno State.
- 4. Promises to maximize financial support provided to students and their families through Federal and State financial aide and through new sources of private funding for scholarships.
- 5. Promises to provide students' access to 15+ units of college courses/semester to stay on track toward graduation.

## **California Promise for Reedley College and Sanger USD Students**

PROMISE: Community College promises one semester of fee-free college (based on AB 1741) for ALL CV Promise eligible HS graduates that have the following criteria for admission in place:

### **Student Criteria to Meet the CV Promise**

- Students MUST have completed CV Promise 6-12 grade activities at the required level
- Students MUST submit a community college Fall application in senior year
- Students MUST have filled out FAFSA or Dream Act application by March of senior year
- Students MUST have either a-g requirements completed or successful progress in a CTE pathway
- Students MUST register for community college classes the fall following HS graduation with a minimum of 15 units (aligned with CCA and CVHEC 15 to Finish Campaign)
- Students MUST have a minimum HS GPA of 2.7
- · Students MUST fully matriculate: SEP, complete the community college orientation process
- Students MUST work toward an AD-T degree or a certificate as articulated in SEP
- Students MUST do community service such as mentoring other students in the first semester in community college
